

3. DISCUSSION

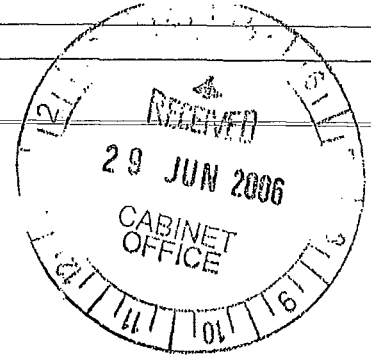

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- Modern police training facilities.
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
3.5 Costs associated with this visit will be met from within the existing budget of the Office of the Minister for Police.
